Recycling Guide

Carefully pull out this helpful recycling guide and stick up in your home so everyone in your family will know what can be recycled.

Do's



- ✓ Be helpful at home and school by putting paper, plastic bottles, food tins and drinks cans in the clear recycling sack
- ✓ Rinse out any food and drink containers before you put them into the clear sack
- ✓ Put all food and garden waste in the green bin
- ✓ Put the yellow battery bag when full on top of your green bin
- ✓ Put all non-recyclable rubbish into black bin bags (not supplied by MK Council)
- ✓ Put rubbish and recycling on the boundary of your home by 7am on your collection day

Don'ts



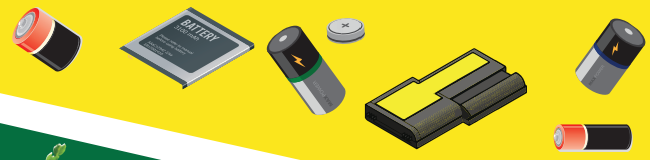
- ✗ Don't mix your rubbish with your recycling. If you do everyone's recycling will be spoilt and may not be recycled
- ✗ Don't put out your recycling earlier than 5pm the day before your collection day
- ✗ Don't pile up your bags with the neighbours in your street

Important nappy information!

If you have a little brother or sister who wears disposable nappies please make sure your parents put all nappies in the black rubbish bag!



What goes where?



- Household batteries
- Button batteries
- Laptop batteries
- Mobile phone batteries



BATTERIES



GREEN BIN

- Fruit and vegetables
- Any leftover food
- Teabags, tea leaves and coffee grounds
- Dairy products
- Meat, bones, fish – cooked or raw
- Bread and pastries
- Branches (less than 15cm diameter)
- Grass clippings
- Weeds



Only these items for recycling...

- Mixed paper, magazines and envelopes
- Cardboard
- Food and drink cartons
- Drinks cans
- Food tins
- Foil trays
- Empty aerosol spray cans
- Plastic bottles and lids
- Plastic food trays and pots



CLEAR SACKS



- Glass bottles and jars (no lids)

BLUE BOX



BLACK SACKS



All other rubbish including:

- Disposable coffee cups
- Wet wipes
- Plastic film and cling film
- All tissues and kitchen towel
- Plastic carrier bags
- Broken glass (wrapped up)
- Dirty nappies and sanitary products
- Pet food pouches
- Clothes, bedding and other textiles
- Pet poo and bedding
- Crisp, sweet & biscuit wrappers

Why do we recycle?
